



The course provides a foundational health in all policies training and follows the main elements of the WHO HIAP Training Manual.

Proposed format; online (hosted on Zoom)

Duration; 1 week, 5 x evening sessions of 2 hours (total 10 hours) Additional aspects; i. pre-workshop tasks and reading, ii. Course assignment for certificate

- •Synergized advocacy and policy impact: to better align on European public health priorities and drive meaningful policy impact.
