### Example of a research abstract/summary

**Title:** Physical activity prevents femoral neck fractures

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(From here, a maximum of 2,800 characters, including spaces, which are inserted in the "Abstract/summary" box in the submission form + a maximum of 200 characters, including spaces, for the main message or implications for prevention, which are inserted in the main message box.)

**Background** Describe the scientific background and rationale for the study, as well as the public health policy significance of the topic. Explain why the study is important and the aim for the study.

**Methods** Describe the design of the study, the setting (such as local community, school, etc.), the participants in the study, the methodology for data collection, and outcome measures.

**Results** Present the most important quantitative and qualitative findings, followed by information on measures of uncertainty. Results that relate to the conclusion should preferably be shown. Since an abstract will later be able to be cited, data must be shown rather than formulations such as "Data will be presented and discussed". If the analyses have not been completed, it may appear that the results are preliminary.

**Conclusions** State the conclusions that are directly supported by the data. Feel free to state recommendations based on the study.

**Main messages or Implications for prevention measures** Max 200 characters summarizing the significance of the work/implications for prevention.
